## ITINERARY

### April 22 – Travel Day / Wisconsin Supper Club

Welcome to your Moostash Joe Tour! Meet us at one of our many convenient pick-up points and head east! Early this evening we arrive and check-in to our downtown accommodations for our four-night stay in vibrant Milwaukee! Known for its lakeside festivals and large breweries, Milwaukee is the largest city in Wisconsin and has become a stylish urban destination while keeping its down-home Midwest appeal. Tonight we experience a longtime authentic, casual Wisconsin Supper Club with a menu consisting of “comfort food!” **(D)**

### April 23 – Treasures of Milwaukee

Our first day in Milwaukee features its treasures and must-see spots. We'll acquaint ourselves with the lakefront city and its stories with our step-on guide before a tour of the historic Pfister Hotel and its extraordinary architecture and Victorian art collection. Then we make our way over to the renowned Harley-Davidson Museum. Whether you were born to be wild, or mild, it makes no difference! The museum offers a glimpse of American history and culture through the successes of the iconic American company. Later this afternoon we'll take a drive through the Yankee Hill neighborhood which include great views of the city and lakefront and we'll take a tour of the Grohmann Museum. The museum, home of the “Men at Work” Collection, features a rooftop sculpture garden and a unique view of the beautiful Milwaukee skyline. A special evening is planned at the most famous German restaurant in North America, Mader's! Founded in 1902, we'll dine on classic German cuisine amidst Bavarian decor, and where its many celebrity guests and past legends ate, including Presidents Ronald Reagan and John F. Kennedy, John Wayne and Frank Sinatra, among many others. **(B, D)**

### April 24 – Milwaukee's Icons

Once known as “The Beer Capital of the World” and home to some of America's most iconic brands, you'll be surprised by the number of products and names you'll recognize and are familiar with that originated in Milwaukee. We'll start our day with a driving tour of Marquette University and a look at the remarkable St. Joan of Arc Chapel. Then, tour the elegantly restored Pabst Mansion, built for Captain Frederick Pabst in the late 19th century. (Do you recall Pabst Blue Ribbon Beer?). We then head back downtown to the Milwaukee Art Museum to explore and to see its iconic addition, the magnificent “Brise Soleil” lift its “wings” at noon. This afternoon features the brew that made Milwaukee famous, Miller Brewery! As the largest brewery in Wisconsin, we'll spend some time touring the brewery as well as at the Miller Inn Tavern for tastings. The fun doesn't stop tonight as we head down to the Riverwalk and the famed Bronze Fonz Statue! Then, enjoy an authentic Beer Hall Bratwurst Dinner at a Craft Brewery. We'll tour the brewery, enjoy four sample brews and learn how this small facility is making their mark! **(B, D)**

### April 25 – Taste of Milwaukee

Bring your appetite today for good food and great fun! This morning discover the history of cheese making at Milwaukee's only cheese factory. Learn why cheese curds are squeaky and why cheddar is yellow! Visit a locally owned Coffee Roasting Company for a taste of Milwaukee's finest coffee. Drive one of Milwaukee's oldest Italian neighborhoods, Brady Street, and enjoy a taste of it at Milwaukee's most famous Italian Market. Take some time to stroll along Milwaukee's Old World Third Street to encounter lots of interesting shops and pubs, including Buck Bradley's, which features the longest bar in the state of Wisconsin! Visit Usinger's, the nationally recognized family business devoted to the craft of sausage making. Over the lunch hour, dine on your own at the Milwaukee Public Market, offering “food hall” style dining and shopping from local restaurants, bakeries and butchers. This afternoon we'll tour the Basilica of St. Josaphat, located in Milwaukee's large Polish community and features one of the largest copper domes in the world. Visit Forest Home, a rare “Garden Cemetery” where the history of the city is traced with names such as Davidson, Schlitz and Pabst. For a snack, we stop to enjoy a Leon's fresh-made frozen custard at this family owned drive-in founded in 1942. All of today's activities culminate to an evening meal at the Stackner Cabaret and performance at the Milwaukee Repertory Theatre. **(B, D)**

### April 26 – Return Home
